The Lord's Supper





¹⁷After this the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, became ill. The Third Article

Sanctification

In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.

This is most certainly true.
