

The question comes up every year. Why do we observe Lent? With a risen Christ, doesn't it seem counterproductive to walk the valley of sorrows for 40 days? Couldn't we just concentrate on Christ's victory and celebrate the devils defeat? Yes we could, but that would not be good for us.

In 1948 Winston Churchill said to the British House of Commons, "Those that fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it". Churchill was wise, because learning from our past causes us to learn more about ourselves and our enemy so we have hope for the future.


In Lent we are more intentionally reminded of our sin and our enemy of death brought on by sin. A cross of hope and promise is traced upon your forehead using the burned up dead ash of last year's palm branches. We hear the words, "from dust you came and to dust you will return". A clear reminder to each of us that we are sinners and sin will bring your death. We remember our past and see clearly our sin so that we see the love of Christ and His sacrifice that gives us a future.



Three times Jesus reminded His disciples about what death demands. Three times Jesus told the 12 He would be handed over to sinful men, tried, crucified, die and be buried. He was reminding them and us of the reality of sin and what it does. It demands a sacrifice. But Jesus also said, "and on the third day I will be raised from the dead".

Our past is a past of sin and death. Hurtful things have been done to us. We have done hurtful things. Remembering our past, the hurt and pain, helps us see the love and mercy of Jesus.

Jesus did not play the victim. He was not helplessly caught in the system. He came and endured all the mocking and beating to accomplish our salvation by His sacrifice on the cross. His sinless blood changed our past. We are forgiven. God remembers no more your sin.



Jesus gives us hope for today and changes our future. We have hope for every event and every day. Our hope stems from an empty tomb and an eternal Victory. Our hope is grounded in a living Savior that beat our enemy. Our hope, Jesus, carries us to confession and absolution remembering our past and confessing our hate and anger and the sin that seeks to kill us. Then hearing the forgiving words of Jesus we are free. Our enemy defeated once again by our risen Christ Jesus.

We have hope for today and for the future. Our hope, Jesus, gives us joy even when we stand by the grave of a dear friend and say "Christ is Risen"! Because of Jesus those who die in faith rise just like Jesus did. We have hope for the future in spite of what we see unfolding on the news. We have hope for tomorrow and next year because Jesus has promised to be with us eternally.

Lent is very important. It forces us to see sin and what it does. But it helps us see even more clearly the love of Jesus for you.

Remembering my past and rejoicing in my present and future in Jesus.




